This month I don't have an article but I do have some brief news that I want to share with you. There are many exciting things happening at COOS. Here are just a few highlights to update you.

**St. John's Chapel**— I am pleased to announce that our plan is to launch St. John's Chapel as a parish at the Diocesan Convention in January 2008! Mtr. Patricia and the lay leadership have been doing such wonderful work and the congregation is growing and thriving. Although the annual giving campaign is not complete, it looks like there will be sufficient funds to move forward as an independent congregation. The Vestry of COOS is in full support of this idea and is committed to making a gift to St. John's Chapel in 2008 in order to make this a reality. I hope you will celebrate with us in the "birthing" of this new church. We give thanks to God for all the faithful people that worship there and rejoice in the presence of God in that place.

**COOS Director of Contemporary Music** — This position which previously has been shared with St. John's Chapel has now been separated. This position at COOS will oversee and provide the music at the Wednesday night and Sunday night worship services. I am thrilled to announce that we have called **Billy Claytor** to be our Director of Contemporary Music.

For three years he was the worship (music) leader at the Episcopal Center at the University of Florida where he offers his many talents. He will be a gift to us and to our worship here at COOS.

Billy is married to Gabby and they have a small child. Billy is also a RN serving in Home Health Care through Baptist Hospital. Welcome Billy back home and into this new position when you see him.



**Organist/Choirmaster Search** — Jan Smith has done an outstanding job as our Interim Organist/Choirmaster. Although we would like to keep her on a permanent basis, that is not possible because of her commute from Amelia Island. Please thank her when you see her for the outstanding ministry that she has done. We wish her the best in her new endeavors and we are so grateful for her time with us and all that she has accomplished with the music program.

We are pleased to announce that we have had many fine resumes submitted for the position from all over the country. The Search Committee, headed by Pete Gentry and Marsa Beck, have narrowed the list down to four outstanding candidates. We are now interviewing these people and will let you know whom we have chosen as soon as that decision is made. Please keep this process in your thoughts and prayers.

**Faith and Life Series** — The past two Lenten seasons we have had an outstanding program on Wednesday nights called the Faith and Life Series. We have brought in people for the community and elsewhere to share their faith. Keep available Wednesday evenings in Lent in 2008. We have some surprises in the works and once again will be inviting some incredible people to share their stories. Look for the announcement of all the details in the near future. Lent begins early in 2008. The first Wednesday night program will begin on **February 13**. Save the dates.

**12 Hours on Ice:** December 21-22 – Cosmic Ice Skating, movies, games and more!


**Dinner & Game Night:** January 5 – We will all go to dinner and then return to the Chapel to play our favorite board games and video games.

### Salvation Army Food Bank is newest SJC Outreach Ministry

St. John's Chapel will be reaching out into the community even more with the Salvation Army Food Bank, which serves individuals and families in St. John's, Flagler and Putnam counties.

St. John's Chapel will "roll out the barrel" for food donations several times a year. Our first collection was for Thanksgiving, and another collection is planned for Christmas. The food bank especially needs staples such as rice, beans, canned meats, vegetables, and fruits.

Wayne Whitehead, Food Bank Program Director, visited St. John's Chapel on November 11 to kick off the ministry. Wayne emphasized that we should not shortchange the Feed My Lambs program. He was assured that our donations would be above and beyond the generosity of the Feed My Lambs food bags donated by SJC & COOS members.

This outreach ministry will be another way that St. John's Chapel supports Millenium Development Goal #1 – to End Hunger and Extreme Poverty.

### 2007 CROP Walk

63 walkers (53 from COOS and 10 from St. John's Chapel) represented our congregations in this year's CROP Walk, raising over \$1600.



The 2007 CROP Walk was held on **Sunday, October 28**. Over 50 of our youth and their families gathered with the other congregations in Mandarin walking together and raising money to fight poverty, hunger, thirst, ignorance and injustice here at home and around the world. There were approximately 125 walkers, and as of press time, almost \$3,600 was raised, and non-perishable food was collected. The proceeds raised by our CROP Walk support Church World Service (CWS) and the Mandarin Food Bank.

The 11th chapter of Isaiah says - *A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.*

Jesse was King David's father. The image of a branch growing out of the roots of Jesse points to a new king in David's line. Christians know that this is fulfilled in Jesus who is a descendent of Jesse. One tradition is to decorate a tree branch with symbols that remember other important persons from the Old Testament. The symbols on the "Jesse Tree" remind us that our belief grows out of deep roots of thousands of years of ancestors in the faith.

This is a story of a newcomer that we never really got an opportunity to get to know.*

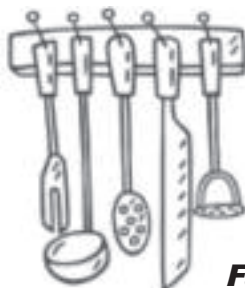
*In the spring of 2007, I met and interviewed Robert Gut. One of the typical questions is what does the newcomer appreciate about Church of Our Saviour. Robert's response was "I appreciate the Prayers of the People."*

*He was referring to the part of our worship that includes us remembering those who have special needs. He went on to say that although he was very ill, seeing his name in the bulletin and on occasion hearing his name mentioned by a reader was a comfort and an encouragement to him.*

*Robert and his wife, Rose had started attending COOS in late 2006. Robert was a retired Publix produce manager and Rose worked at Publix as well, often on Sunday mornings, so they enjoyed the evening worship service.*

*Robert was terminally ill. He came to services (and often Christian Formation) as long as he had the strength. Many times he was accompanied by his son, Ryan. When he died, late in the summer of 2007, more than 200 of his fellow Publix co-workers attended his memorial service at COOS. It was evidence that he enjoyed a wonderful relationship with his peers.*

*We may not have the opportunity to get to know Robert in any other way than this: he was loved and respected by many. But we have the opportunity to get to know other others that will be coming our way and to appreciate the impact our Prayers for the People can have on others.*

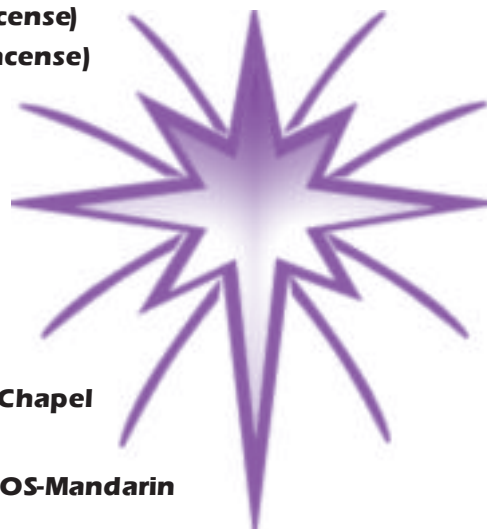
